The 2025 Woodward High School Alumni Hall of Fame Inductees are:

Beth Carol Henderson, 1960

Posthumous Induction

A Renaissance woman, Beth Henderson had a wide range of interests, talents, hobbies, and careers! She played the clarinet in Woodward's band, directed by Sam Szor, and participated in musicals and Extravs. English teacher Marie Ersig inspired and motivated Beth to teach English. She graduated from Bowling Green State University and held a variety of teaching positions throughout her career and beginning in New York state before joining the Peace Corps. She worked with them teaching in Western Samoa and Washington, DC, where she trained Peace Corp volunteers for work overseas. Beth then took a position teaching at an American boarding school in England before returning stateside and settling in Maine where she spent a year teaching at the Passamaquoddy Indian Reservation. Beth also led student trips and student exchanges to the former Soviet Union. She earned her master's degree from the University of Maine and a certificate of advanced study from Harvard School of Education. Following her strong interest in the environment, she became the first woman Ranger in the state of Maine. Following her passion for creating and learning, Beth became a well-known multimedia sculptor in the Northeast. She lived a very full life with diverse interests. Beth passed away on April 17, 2024, and is survived by her partner, Deborah, her brother Dave (Barb), and her sister Barbara (Claude), nephew Heath, and great niece Haley/Hunter.

Stephen R. Toth, 1962

Stephen Toth is a lifelong resident of the Point Place area. While attending Woodward, his favorite teachers were the late Marie Williamson and Ralph Merickle. Stephen followed in his father's footsteps and went to work in 1968 for Ford Motor Company and, later Visteon Corporation, in Monroe, Michigan as a millwright. He had a full career in skilled trades working as a Quality Engineer, Senior Manufacturing Engineer, and retiring as a Project Manager in 2003. After retirement, he founded MDS Enterprises, LLC, a marine service company and obtained his 50-ton Merchant Marine Masters' License. In 2004, Stephen was recruited to join the team establishing a new, innovative charter school-The Maritime Academy of Toledo which launched in 2008. The academy's mission is to provide students with a 'rigorous academic pathways, towards college and career, with a personalized learning experience.' The academy also maintains a partnership with VSTEP for maritime simulators that continues to enhance maritime training excellence throughout the Great Lakes region, a partnership that Stephen helped to facilitate during his time on the board. Following his deep commitment to his Catholic faith, he has also held various leadership positions within the Diocese of Toledo. While he is fully retired from all previous positions, he keeps busy spending time on his own boat, playing golf, and writing a book about St. Peter. He was married for 48 years to the late Barbara (Hilding) and remarried Pamela Thompson in 2017. Their combined family includes six children -Mark, DeAnn, Stephanie, Wendy, Shari, and Holly and eight grandchildren.

Denise Tomanski Meyer, 1968

By the time she was in the 8th grade at St. Adalbert, Denise Tomanski Meyer's teachers noted she had a gift for writing. The educators she encountered at Woodward had a profound impact on her and many left a lasting impression on her and further fostered her writing talents. The encouragement she received from her teachers Susan Hoffman and David McMurray turned Denise's fantasy notion of being a writer into a serious goal and set her on her writing journey. Through her work on The Tattler under the direction of Elaine Markopoulos, she learned to streamline her writing and create interesting feature articles. She incorporates the lessons she learned in her writing to this day. Denise was also an active participant in the Extravaganzas each year and her experiences there led to a longtime enjoyment and involvement in theater. Denise attended the University of Toledo and began her career in education as a Language Arts Teacher for Washington Local Schools before transitioning to a career working in various capacities in communications, advertising, and marketing. She is the recipient of over 75 industry awards for creativity in advertising including six Addy Awards- the advertising world's equivalent of an Oscar. She has also worked in political campaign development in the Toledo area including authoring Mayor Jack Ford's first State of the City Address and as a volunteer with Life Connection of Ohio speaking out about organ donation. She married her late husband, James Patrick Meyer, Sr., and together they had two children, Rachel (Matt) Peterson and James Patrick Meyer, Jr. Denise is also the proud grandmother of five grandchildren, Noel, Ariel, Rose, Lydia, and James Steven. Denise retired in 2015 and currently lives in the Twin Cities area of Minnesota. She has continued to write and is the published author of five books. It was the untimely passing of her husband that was the catalyst for her most personal work, "Dying to Stay." The creative, nonfiction book is about their love story and his death and has received the greatest accolades of her books. She is currently working on completing three other novels.

Daniel C. Tyburski, 1978 Posthumous Induction

Daniel Tyburski grew up in the Polish Village on Maple at Pearl Street. His time at Woodward was punctuated by friends and sports. "Tybo," as he was known in school, played varsity baseball freshman and sophomore year and was a four-year member of the basketball team from which he was named All City and All District. He fondly remembered taking part in a JV game sophomore year where the Polar Bears beat Scott to go on and play Libbey for the City Championship. His most important high school memory was attending the sophomore dance and junior prom with his future wife, Joan Pomorski '76. After graduation, Daniel worked for Libbey-Owens-Ford before beginning his career at the Toledo Jeep Plant. Over his 37-year career he worked in production for 11 years and spent the remaining 26 years as a videographer. In that capacity he managed the corporate TV network and developed and produced content among his duties. In still photos and video, he recorded all the steps in the demolition of the Jeep Parkway Plant and the building and opening of the new plant. Throughout his career, he received many awards for the work he produced including being the recipient of the "Best Local Video" award five times. Daniel was very active within United Auto Workers Local 12 and was a driving force behind the Jeep Employee Legends Run, a charity motorcycle event. He continued his involvement after his retirement as a volunteer with the UAW Local 12 Retiree Advisory Committee. He also served on the board of the Jeep Federal Credit Union. Daniel enjoyed coaching CYO basketball and was proud of his Polish heritage. He was a past president and board member of the Polish Roman Catholic Union of America and a member of the Advisory Committee for the Northwest Ohio Polish Cultural Center. Daniel passed away on November 11, 2024. He is survived by his wife of 41 years, Joan, and sons Danny (Beth) and Jeff (Erica) and five grandchildren, Jeffrey, Hillary, Mallory, Annie and Ava.

Jamie E. Wietrzykowski, 1990

While attending Woodward, Jamie Wietrzykowski was affectionately known as "Alphabet" due to the difficulty people had pronouncing his last name and because of all the letters in it. He worked at Stanley's Market throughout high school and completed a project in his woodshop class to build new kielbasa racks for the store. To the best of his knowledge, those racks are still in use today. After graduation, Jamie went to work for FedEx. In 1999, he began his entrepreneurial career by obtaining his Toledo builder's license and launching his own roofing company, 4 Guys and a Roof. His company has the accreditation of being an Owens Corning Premium Installer, an A+ rating with the Better Business Bureau, and is rated as one of the top roofing installers on Angie's List. Through his business, Jamie has given back to the community by donating roofing services for many projects including pairing up with Owens Corning to install roofs for veterans experiencing economic hardships. His entrepreneurial spirit does not stop with roofing. He has remodeled and sold over 20 homes as well as designed, remodeled, and opened three restaurants including The Mail Pouch in Swanton, OH. Jamie has two children Kayla and Jaxson.

Keith Biler

Faculty; Posthumous Induction

Keith Biler was a music teacher and band director at Woodward from 1963 to 1973. He was born in Holgate, OH, and after his graduation from Holgate High School he worked at the General Motors plant in Defiance. He would go on to receive a bachelor's degree from Bowling Green State University in 1963 and a Master of Music Education degree from the University of Michigan in 1968. In addition to his tenure at Woodward, Keith was a music teacher for several schools in Northwest Ohio during his career directing bands and choruses at Jackson Township Schools in Wood County, Hicksville Exempted Village Schools, and Rossford Schools for 15 years before his retirement in 1987. He always took an interest in his students and had a positive impact on their lives. Many of his students participated in Ohio Music Educators' Association competitions and won high ratings. Keith was also the Assistant Conductor for the Toledo Youth Orchestra and a member of the Toledo Symphonic Orchestra for seven seasons. He truly enjoyed playing at the Toledo Zoo's Summer Concerts. He was a member of the OMEA, president of the American School Band Directors' Association, and a member of Phi Beta Mu (National Band Master Fraternity). His wife, Marlene, preceded him in death in 2011. Keith passed away on October 25, 2014.

Iris E. Szelagowski **Faculty**

For 30 years, Iris Szelagowski was dedicated to creating meaningful learning experiences to motivate students' interest in science and in the world of science education, her efforts put Woodward on the map. She graduated from the University of Toledo in 1967 and began her teaching career at DeVilbiss High School followed by a year at Rogers High School before arriving at Woodward in 1973. She was a soft-spoken, dedicated, extraordinary educator who took research, reports, and critical thinking skills to a higher level. She entered her students in numerous local competitions, which led to many winners going on to national competitions in cities all over the country thus expanding their horizons. She had the students participate in the six week long Ottawa River Student Analysis Project each fall near the school. One year they won "Best Overall Presentation" for their findings at Lourdes College. During her tenure the Woodward Science department was awarded The Battelle Award for Professional Development from the Ohio Academy of Science, an award presented to the most outstanding science department in the state. Iris herself received many honors for her teaching including being named Northwest Ohio Outstanding Science Teacher twice. She also participated in many professional development activities, served on committees, and directed or assisted with many student-centered activities. She also taught at the University of Toledo, Bowling Green State University, and Springfield High School before retiring. In her retirement, she enjoys numerous activities such as traveling, reading, playing the pipe organ, and spending time with her grandchildren. Iris married fellow Woodward science teacher Jerry Szelagowski in 1980. They have two children, Kristen (Rob) Frizzell and Jerry (Jamie) Szelagowski, Jr., nephew Brian Linker, and four grandchildren, Owen, Olivia, Riley, and Sawyer.
